Research Center Spotlight: Count Me In

Count Me In (CMI) empowers cancer patients by giving them an active role in research and providing a platform for them to contribute their valuable medical data. This revolutionized patient-driven approach has not only advanced scientific knowledge but also fostered a sense of community and support among individuals affected by cancer - no matter where they live in the United States or Canada- and particularly among those experiencing osteosarcoma (OS) and leiomyosarcoma (LMS).







CMI has recently expanded its approach to outreach by furthering engagement among Hispanic & Latino identifying patient groups - allowing researchers to have a full scope of ethnic representation in effort to understand the entirety of

these rare diseases. Count Me In, together with Dr. Jennifer Mack from Dana-Farber Cancer Institute, are set to mobilize a newly formed "Stakeholder Advisory Group" to ensure the needs are actively addressed within the members of this multicultural community.

Subcommittee Updates

Health Equity:

- (6/6/23) The subcommittee's Common Data Elements task force met and the Coordinating Center shared the next version of the common data elements catalog. The catalog includes Research Centers' baseline survey questions for participants, and it categorizes those questions into data elements. The task force discussed ways to refine the data element categories and ways to categorize the data elements into domains that are of high priority for the Network.
- (6/6/23) The subcommittee met to review and discuss updates about the common data elements catalog. The Health Equity subcommittee is interested in using the catalog to understand how centers are measuring the social determinants of health.

Participant Engagement:

- (6/8/23) The subcommittee met and Wash-U PE-CGS presented about activities related to their Participant Engagement Unit (PEU) and Engagement Optimization Unit (EOU).
- (6/12/23) The subcommittee's Engagement Catalog task force met and the CC shared that OSU IRB made a non-human subjects research determination for conduct of the task force cataloging activities and interviews with PEU/EOU leads. The task force discussed and identified next steps to start conducting interviews.

Return of Results:

• (6/2/23) The subcommittee's working group on cascade testing met and continued discussions about cross-center collaborations on cascade testing, including project goals, timelines and funding.
